This competition invites 16- to 18-year-olds to submit essays of up to 1,200 words addressing the question: **"Does free speech build or break a community?"**.

Submissions are due by March 31 2025, and the winner will receive a £500 cash prize and have their work published on The Holocaust Listening Project.

Alivio & Esperança (Relief & Hope) - student fundraising campaign

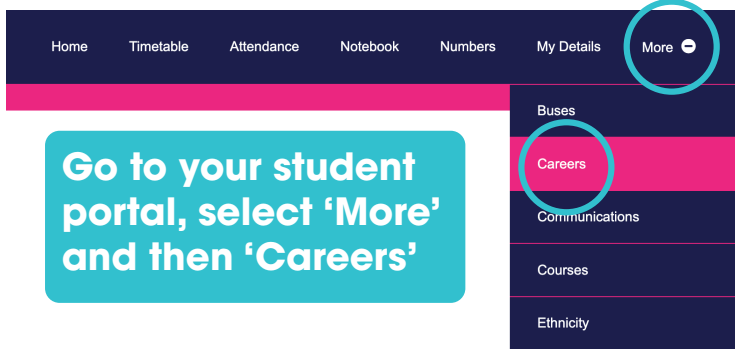

He also considers literature and the environment, discussing how studying literature can help us to think through major global issues, before offering a deep dive into Shakespeare. Psychology Subject Spotlight with Dr Emma Barrowcliffe

Join Dr Emma Barrowcliffe on this fascinating journey into the human mind and understand the unique role of clinical and forensic psychologists. In episode one, Emma establishes the key differences between clinical and forensic psychology, and where they sit in the wider field. In episode two, Emma discusses the various clientele that clinical and forensic scientists may work with, and the settings you may find them in.

Emma also outlines the necessity for ethical considerations as well as the various methods and assessments for clients. In episode three, Emma talks through a case study with a focus on analysing the information and determining how we can successfully assess a client, and what treatments we could adopt for efficient rehabilitation. Finally, in episode four, Emma sets you an activity which asks you to look at another case study, identify the notable causes of the offender's behaviour, and then outline what the best care options look like for the offender.

Social Care

Social care is about helping older people, adults with disabilities, or supporting vulnerable kids and adults through social work. If you want to make a difference in people's lives, this careers for you!

What is Social Care?

Social care is about helping people tackle life's challenges. You could work with older adults, children or people facing mental health struggles, disabilities or homelessness.

What are some of the jobs can I do?

- **Care Assistant:** helping older or disabled people with day-to-day stuff like eating, dressing and taking meds. Whether it's in care homes or people's houses, they make life easier for others.
- **Nurse:** providing medical care for people with specific health needs. They work in care homes or communities, managing conditions, giving meds and helping with clients' general medical care.
- **Social Worker:** helping people through tough times like family issues, addiction, or housing problems. They work in schools, councils or charities, making a big difference in people's lives.
- **Support Worker:** help people with everyday challenges, like living independently or coping with mental health issues, disabilities or homelessness.

What are the top skills?

- Compassion
- Communication
- People Skills
- Resilience
- Time Management

How do I start a career in Sport and Fitness?

- **Apprenticeships:** You could go for apprenticeships like adult care worker (level 2), lead adult care worker (level 3), lead practitioner in adult care (level 4) or train as a social worker (level 6).
- **University:** You can study social work, nursing, or health and social care at uni to get into the social care field. These degrees give you the skills and knowledge employers look for.
- **Postgraduate Qualifications:** You can take a Master's in social work, public health, or even specialise in areas like mental health. Postgrad courses help you level up and get into more advanced roles.
- **Stand Out:** Get hands-on experience through volunteering or internships, work on your people skills, and keep learning. Employers love strong communicators who can handle tough situations with resilience.
